General advice:

Buy a self-supporting tent so that it can be moved in a pinch if you find you picked a bad spot.

Get one that fits on your bike.

Get one with short pole segments so they can be packed in saddlebags (or just plan on packing the poles separately)

Get two doors, failing that, two windows.

Get a vestibule for gear

Don't worry about weight too much - you won't be carrying it on your back

Specific Recommendations:

Eureka Timberline tents (3 votes for this one) - easy up, overhang on doors, vestibule available, "heavy duty" Outfitter version available, 2 & 4 person available

Sierra Designs alpha - easy up, pockets, attic available

REI 4 person

Eureka Apex2 (good for 1 person plus gear)

REI Half Dome Plus2 - cheap, solid, enough room for 2 plus gear

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
